St. Martha's Hall Court Watch Project in support with the member agencies of the St. Louis Ending Domestic and Sexual Violence Network is currently recruiting volunteer monitors to observe courtrooms where civil domestic violence cases are being heard and monitor the proceedings to enhance the response to domestic violence cases.

The Court Watch Project is a community-based initiative within the court system to help improve court processes regarding Order of Protection hearings. The mission of the Court Watch Project is to make the justice system more effective and responsive in handling cases of domestic violence perpetrated against women and children and to create a more informed and involved public. This is a great opportunity for students, victim advocates and community members.

Courtroom monitors are needed for **St. Louis County** courthouse. The times available are:

Monday mornings from 9:00 am to approximately noon.

Monday afternoons from 1:30 pm to approximately 4:30 pm.

Thursday afternoons from 1:30 pm to approximately 4:30 pm.

Courtroom monitors will be needed for **St. Louis City** courthouse later in 2022.
